The draft minutes of the meeting were circulated to all the Senate members. Thereafter the minutes were approved by the Chairman Senate and were circulated amongst the members for information. No comments were received on the minutes.</p> <p>The Senate may kindly confirm the minutes placed as Annexure-A (Pg. 01 to 09).</p>
<p>Item No. 43-2.0</p>	<p>To note the “Action Taken” on the decisions taken in the 42nd meeting of the Senate.</p> <p>The “Action Taken Report” of the 42nd meeting of the Senate is placed as Annexure-B (Pg. 10 to 16) for consideration of the Senate.</p>
<p>Item No. 43-3-0</p>	<p>Items for consideration.</p>
<p>Item No. 43-3.1</p>	<p>To consider the policy for change in grades once the grades are displayed.</p> <p>Guidelines for the award of letter grade are presented at 9 and 10 “MNIT UG Rules and Regulations” and 7.1 and 7.2 of “MNIT PG rules and regulations”. As per these, “A teacher is the best judge in awarding the grades”.</p> <p>As per the regulations, grades need to awarded on the basis of marks obtained by each student in different evaluation components and submitted (including online through ERP) in the Dean Academic office positively within the prescribed time limit as announced in the academic calendar after the End Term examination.</p> <p>As of now, there is no formal mechanism for any change in the grade. As per current practice, any subsequent change in the grade can be permitted only after the request, with due justification(s), from respective course coordinator is recommended favourably through DUGC/DPGC of the concerned department.</p> <p>To ensure that all grades are finalized within a certain duration after the final end term examination, it is proposed that a formal process be defined and included in the regulations. The following is proposed for changing grade of any student once the grades have been displayed.</p> <p>Students should apply for a change in grade within three working days of the grades being displayed. Such applications (dated and signed by the student) should be justified and submitted in hard copy to the course coordinator, who should take an action on all submissions for a given subject. In case, there is a change in grade of any student; this should be corrected and reported with due justifications to respective DUGC/DPGC. After due deliberations on all such cases for the respective degree program, DUGC/DPGC should forward its recommendations to respective Associate Dean/Dean within 7 working days of the grades being displayed. Any application and/or recommendation received afterwards shall not be considered.</p> <p>The proposal is placed for consideration and approval of the Senate.</p>

<p>Item No. 43-3.2</p>	<p>To consider the Mid-term evaluation component for lab courses.</p> <p>As per “MNIT UG Rules and Regulations”, evaluation of a student shall be based on his/her performance in</p> <p>Class Work Sessionals (CWS) Mid-Term Examinations (MTE) and End Term Examinations (ETE) for theory course. The Class work Sessional Exams shall include quizzes, tutorials, homework assignments, term papers, seminars, surprise tests/ class tests/ MCQ tests/ Open book tests/ Group activities etc. and may be conducted by the Course Instructor/ Coordinator during the semester as per his/her course plan. Laboratory</p> <p>Practical Sessionals (PRS) such as practicals, field work etc. and a Practical End Term Exam (PRE) for laboratory course.</p> <p>To improve academic transparency and strengthening academic practices, a meeting of Dean and Associate Deans was held on September 2, 2021. Minutes of meeting are placed at Annexure-C (Pg. 17 to 20). After due deliberations, it was decided that</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">to maintain uniformity and improve seriousness towards laboratory evaluation for both undergraduate and postgraduate courses, a mid-term examination should be mandatory. A laboratory course, therefore, should be evaluated on PRS (Practical Sessionals), PRM (Practical Mid Term Exam) and PRE (Practical End Term Exam). A typical distribution of these components can be PRS: 60%, PRM: 20%, PRE: 20%.</p> <p>The matter is placed before Senate for consideration and approval.</p>
<p>Item No. 43-3.3</p>	<p>To consider the revision in document retention policy.</p> <p>To improve academic transparency and strengthening academic practices, a meeting of Dean and Associate Deans was held on September 2, 2021. Minutes of meeting are placed at Annexure-C (pg. 17 to 20). In view of NBA /academic audit requirements, it was decided to revise document retention policy (reference: Office Order No 83 dated 15-01-2013 in respect of Senate agenda 24-3.10) as follows</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><i>Existing provision: “As per item No 24-3.10 regarding disposal of Mid Term and End Term answer sheets and relevant documents, it was decided that Mid Term and End Term answer sheets may be destroyed after six months from the display of the grades. The time table and course files shall be retained at least for a period of 3 years. Stores section shall be responsible for disposal of above material.”</i></p> <p>Proposed:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The time table and course files: these shall be retained at least for a period of 3 years. In addition, end term answer sheets of best/average/worst performance may be maintained along with the course file of respective year. 2. End term answer sheets: Department shall maintain all end-term examination records for current year and past three years (Academic Year shall be counted from July 1 - June 30). For any student, all end term examination answer sheets shall be

	<p>maintained by respective course coordinators atleast for six months till the award of the provision degree to the student.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. Mid-term answer sheets: these may be destroyed after six months from the display of the grades or date. 4. Marks and Grade sheets: Evaluation sheets showing marks in each component (CWS/MTE/ETE for theory course and PRS/PRM/PRE for laboratory course) as well as grades shall be maintained by the office of respective department. These should be maintained for $(n+1)$ years where n is the duration of the program. 5. Disposal of these answer sheets should be carried out by the respective department.” <p>The matter is placed for consideration and approval of the Senate.</p>
<p>Item No. 43-3.4</p>	<p>To consider making the GATE score mandatory for admission to Ph.D. program with scholarship support.</p> <p>It is proposed that a valid GATE score be made mandatory for admission to Ph.D. program with scholarship support. The GATE score should have been acquired either within past three years or the candidate should have completed Master’s with a valid GATE score.</p> <p>The matter is placed for consideration and approval.</p>
<p>Item No. 43-3.5</p>	<p>To consider the revision in guidelines for Institute Assistantship to a Ph.D. candidate.</p> <p>As per existing PG rules and regulations (3 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. <i>The Institute may provide financial assistance to postgraduate students in the form of teaching or research assistantships (referred to as Institute Assistantship). <u>Assistantships are awarded on a semester to semester basis</u> for a period of up to four semesters for M.Tech./M.Plan. students and up to eight semesters for Ph.D. students. The stipend for the assistantship is paid at the approved rates as notified by AICTE/MHRD from time to time. A student is expected to devote about eight hours per week towards job(s) assigned to him/her by the department. The renewal of assistantship is contingent on the student's satisfactory performance in the academic programme and in the satisfactory discharge of assistantship duties as assigned to him by the department.</i> <p>In the current practice a supervisor needs to certify that a student has worked for 8 hours per week for the release of the institute assistantship (IA).</p> <p>Academic section has received many plea instances where students have requested for their IA to be released as respective supervisor has not forwarded the request for many months even within same semester. To ensure that students’ interests are protected while academic quality of research work is preserved, nature of work that</p>

	<p>entitle a student for scholarship needs to be quantified. Should a student qualify for IA partially for the teaching related job assigned to him or his/her research progress should be taken into consideration too? It is requested that Senate may draft guidelines for</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) What constitutes quantum of work that a student needs to contribute towards continuation of his/her IA? 2) Under what circumstances IA can be suspended, discontinued, reinstated and what should be the procedure for the same? 3) Can IA be released partially if the concerned student has carried out teaching related academic duties assigned to him? 4) Can a supervisor or committee recommend switching scholarship to another student? If yes, what should be the guidelines? <p>Agenda is placed for deliberations and framing of guidelines by the Senate.</p>
<p>Item No. 43-3.6</p>	<p>To consider the proposal of Department of Metallurgical and Materials Engineering to permit second year M. Tech. students for the research projects with institute scholarship to eminent government research organisations for the period of 3-6 months.</p> <p>It is proposed that the M. Tech. student may be permitted for the period up to 6 months to the reputed research organisation such as CSIR-NML, CSIR-NCL, IITs or similar type organizations of high repute and world-class laboratories. This will provide the students good research exposure and the opportunity to learn the skills and acquire the knowledge that can help him/her shape their career in a much better way.</p> <p>This will also enhance collaboration between the academic institute and research organisation. Moreover, there will be more possibility for good quality research publications in international/national journals.</p> <p>As per current provision, a student is not entitled to Institute assistantship support once he joins an organization/Institute for internship. It is proposed that the assistantship of the student be continued provided</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) he joins a Government organization/Institute and (2) produces a certificate from the organization/Institute to the effect that no financial subsistence/assistantship is being provided to the student <p>The matter is placed before Senate for consideration and approval.</p>
<p>Item No. 43-3.7</p>	<p>To consider the articles published in paid open access journal publications.</p> <p>As per MNIT PG rules and regulations,</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>9.3 PUBLICATIONS ARISING OUT OF PH.D.</i></p> <p><i>Before any thesis is approved for submission by DREC and DPGC, it should be ensured that the work done has been sufficiently peer reviewed. It is required that at least, one paper should have been published (or accepted) in a reputed research journal or two papers in peer reviewed reputed conferences. The candidate shall produce evidence for the same in the form</i></p>

	<p><i>of acceptance letter or reprints and/or reviewers' comments. The list of such reputed journals and conferences may be prepared before-hand by DREC and approved by DPGC/SPGB.</i></p> <p><i>In 38th Senate meeting, vide agenda 38-3.12, above was revised as follows:</i></p> <p><i>For Ph.D. submission the student must submit proof of acceptance/publication of at least one paper in SCOPUS/ESCI/SSCI/SCI Journal and two papers in reputed conference OR two papers in SCOPUS/ESCI/SSCI/SCI Journal. This shall be applicable for the candidates admitted from July 2019 onwards</i></p> <p>Though the above does not stipulate the nature of publications, it is expected that the publication should be of repute. In recent times, some of the journal publications have become open access. As opposed to the traditional subscription model in which readers have access to research articles by paying a subscription, open access is a publishing model that makes research articles available to readers free of cost. Overheads of the publication are covered through charging fees from the authors. This, however, has raised the questions about the quality of research articles published in these journals.</p> <p>It is proposed that a research article published in open access journal can be considered to meet requirements of PhD thesis submission provided it is a Scopus/SCI/SCI-E publication.</p> <p>The matter is placed before Senate for consideration and approval.</p>

MINUTES OF 42ND MEETING OF SENATE HELD ON 09TH SEPTEMBER 2021

The 42nd meeting of Senate was held on 9th September 2021 from 9.00 AM onwards in NKN-1, first floor, Prabha Bhawan of the Institute. The meeting was held online. In all 63 members attended the meeting. At the outset, the Chairman Senate welcomed all the Senate members. After due deliberation, following decisions were taken.

Item No. 42.1.0	:	To confirm the minutes of the 41st meeting of the Senate held on March 18th, 2021. The 41 st Senate meeting was held on March 18 th , 2021. The degree program can be started without any additional financial liability to MNIT.2. The degree program should be started and run with existing regular faculty strength.3. Approved course structure should be aligned to make provisions for certificate courses as exit policy of the program. Revisions In the structure should be submitted to the Academic Section. <p>Senate approved the following in respect of eligibility and admission process of this program.</p> <p>Eligibility:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The applicant must have a Bachelor's degree in Science/Humanities and Social Sciences /Management/ Commerce/ Engineering/Architecture.• The applicant should have a minimum of 6.5 CGPA on the 10 point scale (60% marks, only where CGPA is not awarded) with a relaxation for SC/ST implying minimum of 6.0 on the 10 point scale (55% marks, only where CGPA is not awarded)• Reservation policy as stipulated by Government of India/MoE (Ministry of Education) shall be applicable.• Eligibility criteria shall be as per MNIT PG regulations from time to time <p>"Admission Process"</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• One of the essential eligibility criteria would be to qualify the GATE (Humanities and Social Sciences) /CUSET (conducted by Central Universities)/National level test conducted by consortium of IITs/CFTIs
Item No. 42-3.2	:	To consider the guidelines for maintaining academic integrity.

	<p>This matter was deliberated at length and Senate approved the following.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Self-similarity for plagiarism check for Project /Dissertation/Thesis reports submitted respectively by UG/PG/Ph.D. students shall be as per the following <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. "Maximum 8 word count" and b. Excluding self citations 2. Maximum 15% similarity index is allowed for the project reports/dissertation/thesis. However, a maximum of 20% similarity index is allowed only if similarity index from each individual source remains less than 1%. 																
<p>Item No. 42-3.3</p>	<p>: To consider the proposal to revise the eligibility criteria for admission to Ph.D. Programmes in the Department of Management Studies.</p> <p>The Senate approved the revision in eligibility criteria for Ph.D. admission as proposed by the Department of Management Studies (DMS). Senate-approved eligibility criteria for DMS is as follows: <i>"the applicant must have a two-year post-graduate degree or equivalent from a recognized institute/University with CGPA not below 6.5 on a ten-point scale or 60% marks (where CGPA is not awarded). For equivalence of program, a certificate from AIU to this effect is mandatory"</i> <i>All other conditions except for education qualifications shall be as per MNIT PG regulations.</i></p>																
<p>Item No. 42-3.4</p>	<p>: To consider the proposal to add "Absolute Method for Award of Grades" in PG regulations for courses where number of registered students is not more than 30.</p> <p>Senate approved incorporation of "Absolute Method for Award of Grades" in PG regulations for courses where number of registered students is not more than 30. As per this method, the award of grades based on absolute marks out of 100 shall be based on the marks distribution as given in following Table. A meeting of Dean and Associate Deans, Academic Section, was convened on September 2, 2021 at 3PM. Following members were present.

1. Prof. Urmila Brighu, Dean (Academics)
2. Prof. Kanupriya, Associate Dean (PG)
3. Dr. Anil Swarnkar, Associate Dean (UG)
4. Prof. Vijay Laxmi, Associate Dean (Academics)

Main agenda of the meeting was to improve academic transparency and strengthening academic practices. After due deliberations, following decisions were taken

1. To maintain uniformity and improve seriousness towards laboratory evaluation for both undergraduate and postgraduate courses, it was decided that a
 - a) One mid-term examination should be mandatory. A laboratory course, therefore, should be evaluated on PRS (Practical Sessionals), PRM (Practical Mid Term Exam) and PRE (Practical End Term Exam). A typical distribution of these components can be PRS: 60%, PRM: 20%, PRE: 20%. The matter should be placed before senate for approval.
 - b) end-term examination of the lab courses shall be held by two faculty members other than course instructor(s).
2. During mid-term and end-term examinations, all departments should ensure
 - a) at least one faculty invigilator per room.
 - b) Seating plan for the students (a sample is attached herewith and to be displayed on the notice board along with the time table)
3. For M.Tech thesis evaluation in III and IV semesters (V and VI semesters for Part-Time students), at least one midterm review should be held. A committee consisting of at least three faculty members from the department, including the supervisor(s), should do this review. This evaluation should carry a weight of 30% towards overall evaluation.
4. It was decided that a policy needs to be devised for maintaining e-records. Dean (Academics) was requested to constitute a committee in this respect.
5. It was decided that the merit boards listing the UG gold medalists shall be maintained at VLTC.
6. In view of NBA and academic audit requirements, it was decided to revise document retention policy (reference: Office Order No 83 dated 15-01-2013 in respect of Senate agenda 24-3.10) as follows
Existing provision: "As per item No 24-3.10 regarding disposal of Mid Term and End Term answer sheets and relevant documents, it was decided that Mid Term and End Term answer sheets may be destroyed after six months from the display of the grades. The timetable and course files shall be retained at least for a period of 3 years. Stores section shall be responsible for disposal of above material."

Proposed:

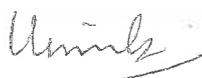
1. The time table and course files: these shall be retained at least for a period of 3 years. In addition, end term answer sheets of best/average/worst performance may be maintained along with the course file of respective year.
2. End term answer sheets: Department shall maintain all end-term examination records for current year and past three years (Academic Year shall be counted from July 1 - June 30). For any student, all end term examination answer sheets shall be maintained by respective course coordinators atleast for six months till the award of the provision degree to the student.
3. Mid-term answer sheets: these may be destroyed after six months from the display of the grades or date.
4. Marks and Grade sheets: Evaluation sheets showing marks in each component (CWS/MTE/ETE for theory course and PRS/PRM/PRE for laboratory course) as well as grades shall be maintained by the office of respective department. These should be maintained for (n+1) years where n is the duration of the program.
5. Disposal of these answer sheets should be carried out by the respective department."

Committee members asked AD (Academics) to explore if uploading of these marks could be facilitated on ERP.

It was decided that the matter be placed before Senate for consideration and approval.

7. For UG students registering for 7th semester, starting from October 2nd week, lecture classes shall be held in on-line mode till further orders while lab classes shall be held in off-line mode (students have to be physically present in the lab).
8. It was decided that all MTech/MPlan and PhD students drawing scholarship should report to campus by September 27, 2021 failing which their scholarship shall not be released for the period of absence counted from September 28, 2021 till they report to MNIT. All departments should maintain a register for the attendance record of PG/PhD students till a decision on biometric attendance is enacted.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the chair.

Table Agenda No. 43-5.1	: To consider the issue regarding waiving off the written test for entrance in Ph.D. programmes of the institute for those who have cleared the UGC NET examination (with scholarship). The matter regarding waiving off the written test for entrance in Ph.D. programme of the institute for those who have cleared the UGC NET examination (with scholarship) was discussed in 23 rd meeting of Academic Affairs Committee held on 6 th December 2021. The committee deliberated upon the issue and unanimously agreed that UGC NET examination is a national level examination and the requirement of written test for admission in Ph.D. programme in MNIT can be waived off for those who have cleared the NET examination (With scholarship). Hence, in order to encourage the students who have cleared the NET examination (with scholarship) in Sciences, Humanities & Social Sciences and Management Studies to pursue Ph.D. at MNIT, Jaipur, The committee decided to waive off the requirement of Ph.D. written examination for those who have cleared the UGC NET examination (with scholarship). However, such candidates will be required to appear for the interview and if selected, they may be offered the Ph.D. programme at MNIT, Jaipur. It is proposed that the same waiver should also be given to all candidates who have cleared UGC/CSIR examination or have Inspire Fellowship. The list is placed before the Senate for its approval.
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
