2.Introduction:

3.Event Description:

The event was structured into two intense phases, each designed to test various facets of debating and parliamentary skills.

- **Phase 1: Knowledge Kills Fear (Elimination Round)**

* This phase followed the Indian Parliament system with two teams facing each other per round.

- * It featured a free-flow discussion after initial opening statements, allowing for cross-questions and rebuttals at any time.
- * Each round included 5 minutes of preparation time and 10 minutes of total debate time.
- * The round concluded with audience cross-questioning, where individual points were awarded to engaged listeners.

- **Final Round: Sansad Ka Faisla**

- * The finale featured the top two teams in a deeper discussion with an extended time of 15 minutes.
- * This round demanded higher quality in logic, depth of content, and rebuttal skills.
- * Teams provided final summarizations before a final session of audience cross-questioning.
